



Farrington Highway Safety Measures Near Makaha Beach Park

Project Synopsis

In an effort to address safety related issues near Makaha Beach Park, the state Department of Transportation will be reducing existing speed limits on Farrington Highway in the vicinity of Makaha Beach Park from 35 to 25 MPH between Upena and Lawaia Streets.

Rumble strips will be installed on Farrington Highway to alert motorists of the lower speed limit area ahead. In the Honolulu-bound direction, they will be installed between Lawaia and Makau Streets and in the Makaha-bound direction, between Upena Street and Kili Drive. The rumble strips will produce a physical vibration and an audible sound when vehicles roll over them to alert motorists to drive with caution.



These safety measures will help to address community concerns about speeding along Farrington Highway approaching the Makaha Beach Park area. All roadway users will benefit from the safer environment created by the lower speed limit.

Installation Schedule

Installation of the new signage and rumble strips is scheduled on Mondays through Fridays, from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., daily, beginning on Monday, June 17, through Friday, July 12, 2013.
