

old a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others see you.

New Always stand back a step from the curb until it is time to cross.

ook left, right and left again and check for turning cars before and while crossing the street. Cross only at crosswalks.

ower electronic devices and keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.

only walk on sidewalks whenever possible, or on the far left side of the road facing traffic to stay safe.

ear a highly visible or reflective costume or put reflective stickers on clothing, trick-or-treat bags or toys.

specially be sure to pay attention when walking past driveways to make sure cars aren't pulling in or out.


ye contact with drivers to ensure they see you before crossing in front of them is important.

ever cross when you see the countdown signal with the red stop hand. Cross only when you see the "walking man" signal.

Bee Safe Pedestrian Safety Tips

Bee Alert

- Before crossing the street, stop at the curb, or edge of the street
- · Always look left, right, then left again
- · Continue looking until you have crossed the street
- Watch for cars backing up and turning drivers don't always see you
- Make sure drivers see you; try to make eye contact before crossing

Bee Careful

- · Walk facing traffic if you aren't on a sidewalk
- · Obey signs and signals
- · Don't run out between parked cars
- · Use extra caution when playing near the street
- · Don't play in the street

Bee Seen

- · Wear bright colored clothing during the day
- · Carry a flashlight or wear reflective material when it's dark
