#### II. Approval of the Minutes

Past meeting minutes were approved as follows:

- a. July 30, 2024
  - Heidi Hansen-Smith motioned to approve the July 30 meeting minutes, which was seconded by Jesse Domian. Luke Sarvis and James Burke abstained from the vote, as they had not been present at the July 30 meeting and had not had a chance to review the notes. With no other objections, the July 30 minutes were approved.
- b. August 15, 2024
  - Hansen-Smith motioned to approve the August 15 meeting minutes, which was seconded by Domian. Again, Sarvis and Burke abstained from the vote, as they had not reviewed the notes. The August 15 minutes were approved with the two abstentions.
- c. August 27, 2024
  - The approval of the August 27 minutes was tabled, as the committee had not yet had a chance to review them.
- d. September 24, 2024
  - The approval of the September 24th minutes was also tabled, as the committee had not yet seen them.

#### III. Presentation on City and County of Honolulu's Safe Routes to School Work

Yamato Sasaki provided a detailed presentation on the City and County of Honolulu's Safe Routes to School program. Sasaki covered the student population on O'ahu, the distribution of schools, and the program's focus areas, which include promoting inclusive walking and rolling, increasing driver safety culture, and enhancing crosswalks and walkways.

Discussion touched on the program's funding sources, including the Safe Routes to Schools special fund and transportation alternative program (TAP) funds, as well as the program's history and funding breakdown over the past seven fiscal years. Burke inquired about the future plans for the program, and Sasaki explained that the continuation of the program would depend on securing ongoing funding. Sasaki was also asked if he had official numbers on the non-student population living within the walk zones, and Sasaki agreed to provide that information. The committee emphasized the importance of improving conditions for walking and rolling to school, as it benefits the broader community, not limited to students.

# IV. Discussion and Appropriate Action on Approach to Meeting Law's Mandate The chair shared a proposed draft of the annual report and recommendations on how to encumber the \$10 million in funding. The proposal included three main components:

- a. Funding for the creation of a comprehensive statewide Safe Routes to Schools plan, including goals, strategies, performance metrics, and methods to ensure the stability and consistency of the funding.
- b. Staffing support for five years, including six full-time positions for state, county, and Department of Education Safe Routes to School coordinators.
- c. Specific priorities and a process for funding plans and projects, including both proactive and reactive approaches.

Burke raised the importance of having a consultant to support the committee in developing the statewide plan, and the chair acknowledged that additional support would be crucial given the tight timeline. Burke motioned to approve the three-part proposal, and Hansen-Smith seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Yamato Sasaki and Jessica Thompson, members of the PIG, briefly presented a draft proposal for designing "a clear and transparent process for the advisory committee to identify, evaluate, and recommend projects for funding". Sasaki and Thompson will update PIG's proposal updated to align with the "report and recommendations" presented by chair and approved by committee just prior to the presentation of the PIG's process presentation.
