II. Presentation by Hawaii Department of Education

Megan Omura from the Hawaii Department of Education provided an update on student transportation initiatives, including:

- Efforts to find more CDL drivers to restore suspended bus routes on Oahu, many of which have been restored.
- The use of tour buses as a temporary measure to supplement transportation, and the need to raise awareness for drivers to stop for these buses
- Plans to expand the Express program, which provides free county bus transportation for qualifying students, to include middle and high school students.
- There was discussion and Q&A between the committee members and Megan regarding the transportation challenges, safety concerns, and potential solutions like the carpool pilot program being implemented.

III. Discussion and Appropriate Action on Approach to Meeting Law's Mandate

The committee reviewed the draft report to the legislature that was provided two weeks prior. The report included a summary of the committee's work, an overview of the current state of student transportation in Hawaii, and a list of potential projects and initiatives to address identified needs and gaps. The committee discussed the public comment period that is open until the end of the month, during which time additional feedback and project proposals can be submitted for inclusion. Laramee made a motion to approve the draft report with the understanding that minor amendments may be made based on the public comments received. The motion was seconded by Burke and approved by the committee.

III. Open Forum

During the open forum, several members of the public provided comments and insights related to the Safe Routes to School efforts.

- A member of the public raised concerns about children waiting for buses in secluded areas, as well as an incident of a disabled student being assaulted on a school bus in Logan V. R
- The committee acknowledged the concerns and Domian and Sasaki offered to follow up with the individual after the meeting to gather more details and see how the committee could potentially assist.

IV. Announcements

The committee also discussed upcoming presentations and speakers, including the National Center for Safe Roads and Square Rocks the Schools, and the potential for the county of Maui and the Safe Routes Partnership to present in future meetings.
