Dear Cargo Operators, Terminal Operators, Land-Based Fueling Companies and Harbor Agents:

Subject: Implementation of New Tariff Rates That Take Effect July 1, 2015 Affecting Cargo Wharfage, Storage, Demurrage and Ship-Related Activities As Provided by Chapter 19-44, Hawaii Administrative Rules

The purpose of this letter is to provide information and clarification concerning the implementation and application of the new tariff rates that will take effect July 1, 2015. Hawaii Administrative Rules, (HAR), §19-44-73 provides for annual rate increases to be implemented every July 1st to the Wharfage and Pipeline Toll Rates that are in effect as of immediately preceding June 30th. Pursuant to HAR §19-44-73 the rate increase that takes effect July 1, 2015 is to be the higher of 3% or the increase in the Consumer Price Index for Calendar Year 2014 ("SOH CPI for 2014") for the State of Hawaii, as determined by the U.S. Department of Commerce Bureau of Statistics. The Wharfage and Pipeline Toll Rates will increase by 3% effective July 1, 2015 because the SOH CPI for 2014 was approximately 1.8%, which was lower than 3%.

The increased rates will be applied as follows:

A vessel entering and docking at any of our commercial harbors at or after 12:00 a.m. July 1, 2015 will be charged the fees applicable to the voyage at the July 1, 2015 rates. A representative listing of such fees, but not an all inclusive listing of these fees, includes fees for wharfage, pipeline tolls, bunkering activity and for the use of pipelines to transport or to load potable water.

A vessel entering and docking at any of our commercial harbors no later than 11:59 p.m. on June 30, 2015, will be charged Wharfage and or Pipeline Toll fees applicable to the voyage at the rates in effect prior to July 1, 2015. Any charges related to any use of harbor facilities or any services provided on or after July 1, 2015 such as bunkering charges or charges for the use of pipelines to transport or to load potable water will be assessed at the July 1, 2015 rates.

There are no changes to the tariff rates for properly approved storage of shipping devices pursuant to §19-44-43(d) nor are there changes to the tariff rates for demurrage charges pursuant to §19-44-83.

As communicated to you in our letters dated January 26, 2010 and March 1, 2010, the approved amendments to Chapter 19-44, HAR effective February 1, 2010, are available on the DOT Harbors website, <a href="http://hawaii.gov/dot/harbors/library">http://hawaii.gov/dot/harbors/library</a>.

Revised self-report forms that reflect the new rates that take effect July 1, 2015 must be completed and submitted to report cargo related activities and user fees that occur on or after July 1, 2015. These revised self-report forms will be available on the DOT Harbors website, <a href="http://hawaii.gov/dot/harbors/doing-business">http://hawaii.gov/dot/harbors/doing-business</a> no later than June 30, 2015.

The following is a listing of the revised self-report forms that will reflect the new rates that take effect July 1, 2015:

Please note that the Harbors Division will accept, as valid, the quantities that are reported rounded to two decimal places for the units of measure —"ton" (example: 38.25 tons) and "mbf"—and the Harbors Division will accept as valid, quantities that are reported rounded to four decimal places for the unit of measure —"bbl"—. All other quantities reported using the unit of measure of "each," which is generally used, but not limited to, for the reporting of quantities for automobiles, shipping devices, empties and pallet load and the unit of measure "head" which is used to report livestock, must be reflected on these Wharfage reports as whole numbers with no decimals; decimals are not considered as valid reporting of the quantities for these units of measure, (each and head), for these types of cargo, as such, the reporting of decimals are not allowed. Reports reflecting data with decimals for units of measure "each" or "head" may be considered to be invalid reports and as reports that are not properly filed that the Harbors Division can possibly reject, which may render those reports to be delinquent reports subject to delinquent report charges as provided for in §19-44-6.1.

Although the charge for empty containers was eliminated by the approved amendments to Chapter 19-44, HAR effective February 1, 2010, all empty container activity must be reported on the Wharfage Self-report forms. It is important to provide this information to DOT Harbors so that it can maintain accurate statistical information for container activity, including that of empty containers, at Hawaii's harbors. It should be noted that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers tracks this data and uses this data to make decisions that affect the Hawaii Commercial Harbors System.

Please remember to use the proper self-report forms to report cargo related activities and user fees that occur on or before June 30, 2015 by completing and submitting those forms that specify in their titles, "Rates Effective 07/01/2015 to 06/30/2015." All activity occurring on or after July 1, 2015 must be reported by completing and submitting those forms that specify in their titles, "Rates Effective 07/01/2015 to 06/30/2016."
