Dear Cargo Operators, Terminal Operators, Land-Based Fueling Companies, and Harbor Agents:

Subject: COURTESY REMINDER: Implementation of New Rules and Tariff Rates Affecting Vessel Dockage, Cargo Wharfage and Pipeline Toll Rates, and Port Entry Fees, Effective July 1, 2018, Pursuant to Chapter 19-44, Hawaii Administrative Rules

On April 8, 2018, several amendments to Chapter 19-44, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), were approved. The new rule language is available online at: <http://hidot.hawaii.gov/harbors/library/admin-rules/>. Starting on July 1, 2018, the following new rules and tariff rates affecting vessel dockage, cargo wharfage and pipeline toll rates, and port entry fees will be in effect:

- **§19-44-20, Full Dockage Rates.** There is a new exhibit entitled "DOCKAGE RATES" dated July 1, 2018. Effective July 1, 2018, for vessels longer than 900 linear feet or 274.32 meters, the dockage rate is \$3,162.50 plus an additional \$9.15 per additional linear foot or fraction thereof (or \$30.00 per additional linear meter or fraction thereof). Additional rate increases set forth in the new exhibit will become effective in future years.
- **§19-44-64, Waiver of Wharfage.** Effective immediately, wharfage will not be assessed on a cargo shipping company that transports its own dunnage and stevedoring equipment, commonly referred to as "company business," in shipping devices or containers, if it does not generate revenue to the cargo shipping company. However, wharfage shall be assessed on any dunnage and stevedoring equipment that is not company business and generates revenue.
- **§19-44-66, Wharfage Rates.** There is a revised exhibit entitled "WHARFAGE RATES" dated July 1, 2018. Effective July 1, 2018, the wharfage rates will be increased by 15% over the wharfage rates that are in effect on June 30, 2018, with

the exception of wharfage rates for containers longer than 45 feet, which are reduced as reflected in the exhibit.

- **§19-44-92, Port Entry Fee Schedule.** There is a new exhibit entitled “PORT ENTRY FEE SCHEDULE (July 1, 2018).” Effective July 1, 2018, for vessels longer than 900 linear feet or 274.32 meters, the port entry rate for Honolulu and Kalaeloa Barbers Point Harbors is \$611.88 plus an additional \$2.13 per additional linear foot or fraction thereof (or \$7.00 per additional linear meter or fraction thereof), and the port entry rate for all other harbors is \$378.13 plus an additional \$1.52 per additional linear foot or fraction thereof (or \$5.00 per additional linear meter or fraction thereof). Additional rate increases set forth in the new exhibit will become effective in future years.

The increased rates will be applied as follows:

- Any vessel entering and docking at any of our commercial harbors at or after 12:00 a.m. July 1, 2018, will be charged the fees applicable for the voyage at the July 1, 2018, rates. A representative listing of such fees, but not an all-inclusive listing of these fees, includes dockage fees for vessels longer than 900 linear feet, a facilities securities fee assessed for each container shipped, fees for wharfage, pipeline tolls, bunkering activity, and fees for the use of pipelines to transport or to load potable water.
- Any vessel entering and docking at any of our commercial harbors no later than 11:59 p.m. on June 30, 2018, will be charged Wharfage and/or Pipeline Toll fees applicable to the voyage at the rates in effect prior to July 1, 2018. Any charges related to any use of harbor facilities or any services provided on or after July 1, 2018, such as bunkering charges or charges for the use of pipelines to transport or to load potable water, will be assessed at the rates that become effective July 1, 2018.
- For the period from July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, there are no changes to the tariff rates for Full Dockage Rates for vessels shorter than or equal to 900 linear feet pursuant to §19-44-20, for properly approved storage of shipping devices pursuant to §19-44-43(d), for demurrage charges pursuant to §19-44-83, nor are there changes to the tariff rates for the Port Entry Fee Schedule for vessels shorter than or equal to 900 linear feet pursuant to §19-44-92.

Revised self-report forms that reflect the new rates that take effect July 1, 2018, must be used, completed, and submitted to report the cargo-related activities and user fees that occur on or after

July 1, 2018. These revised self-report forms will be available no later than June 30, 2018, on the DOT Harbors Division website at the following link:  
<http://hawaii.gov/dot/harbors/doing-business>. The following is a listing of the revised self-report forms that will reflect the new rates that take effect July 1, 2018:

- Overseas Wharfage Report;
- Overseas Transshipment Wharfage Report (65a);
- Inter-Intra-Island Wharfage Report;
- Inter-Intra-Island Transshipment Wharfage Report 65(b) and 65(c);
- Inter-Intra-Island Transshipment Wharfage Report 65(d);
- Pipeline Toll Report (Private); and
- Pipeline Toll Report (State).

Please remember to use the proper self-report forms to report cargo-related activities and user fees that occur on or before June 30, 2018, by completing and submitting those forms that specify in their titles, “Rates Effective 10/01/2017 to 06/30/2018.” All activity occurring on or after July 1, 2018, must be reported by completing and submitting those forms that specify in their titles, “Rates Effective 07/01/2018 to 06/30/2019.”

The DOT Harbors Division will accept, as valid, the quantities that are reported rounded to two decimal places for the units of measure “ton” (example: 38.25 tons) and “mbf.” The DOT Harbors Division will accept, as valid, quantities that are reported rounded to four decimal places for the unit of measure “bbl.”

All other quantities reported for the unit of measure “each,” which is generally used for, but not limited to, the reporting of quantities for automobiles, shipping devices, empties and pallet load, and the unit of measure “head,” which is used to report livestock, must be reflected on these wharfage reports as whole numbers with no decimals; decimals are not considered as valid reporting of the quantities for these units of measure (“each” and “head”) for these types of cargo; as such, the reporting of decimals is not allowed. Reports reflecting data with decimals for the units of measure “each” or “head” may be considered to be invalid reports that have not been properly filed and may be rejected by the DOT Harbors Division; such rejection may render those reports to be delinquent reports subject to delinquent report fees/charges as provided for in §19-44-6.1, HAR.

Also, although the charge for empty containers was eliminated by the approved amendments to Chapter 19-44, HAR, effective February 1, 2010, all empty container activity must be reported on the wharfage self-report forms. It is important to provide this information to the DOT Harbors Division so that it can maintain accurate statistical information of all container activity, including that of empty containers, at Hawaii’s commercial harbors.


