Subject: **COURTESY REMINDER**
Implementation of New Tariff Rates to Take Effect October 1, 2017 Affecting
Cargo Wharfage and Pipeline Toll Rates, Containerized Cargo Activities as
Provided by Chapter 19-44, Hawaii Administrative Rules

State of Hawaii Department of Transportation Harbors Division, (DOT Harbors), letter HAR-S 3895.17 dated December 27, 2016, notified all Harbor Users of the series of increases in wharfage tariff rates, pipeline use fees and bunkering fees scheduled to take effect on February 1, 2017, on October 1, 2017 and on July 1, 2018. These increases were approved by Governor Ige on December 12, 2016 as amendments to Chapter 19-44 Hawaii Administrative Rules and these increases are pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rule, (HAR) §19-44-73.

This DOT Harbors letter is a courtesy reminder to all Harbor Users that rates will increase effective October 1, 2017 for Wharfage Fees, Pipeline Toll Fees and Bunkering Fees. These new tariff rates reflect an increase of 15% to the Wharfage Fee, Pipeline Toll Fee and Bunkering Fee Rates that are currently in effect through September 30, 2017.

DOT Harbors will apply these increased rates to the pertinent cargo shipped as follows:

Any vessel entering and docking at any of our commercial harbors at or after 12:00 a.m. October 1, 2017, will be charged the fees applicable for the voyage at the October 1, 2017 rates. A representative listing of such fees, but not an all-inclusive listing of these fees, includes a facilities securities fee assessed for each container shipped, fees for wharfage, pipeline tolls, bunkering activity and fees for the use of pipelines to transport or to load potable water.

Any vessel entering and docking at any of our commercial harbors no later than 11:59 p.m. on September 30, 2017, will be charged Wharfage and or Pipeline Toll fees applicable to the voyage at the rates in effect prior to October 1, 2017. Any charges related to any use of harbor facilities, or for any services provided by DOT Harbors on or after October 1, 2017 such as bunkering charges or charges for the use of pipelines to transport or to load potable water will be assessed at the rates that become effective October 1, 2017.

There are no changes to the tariff rates for Full dockage rates pursuant to HAR §19-44-20, for properly approved Storage of shipping devices pursuant to HAR §19-44-43(d), for Demurrage charges pursuant to HAR §19-44-83, nor are there changes to the tariff rates for the Port entry fee schedule pursuant to HAR §19-44-92.

As communicated to you in our letter, HAR-S 3895.17, dated December 27, 2016, the approved amendments to Chapter 19-44, HAR effective December 12, 2016, are available on the DOT Harbors website <https://hidot.hawaii.gov/harbors/files/2013/01/HAR-19-44-Adopted-Amendments-12-23-2016.pdf>,

Revised self-report forms that reflect the new rates that take effect October 1, 2017 must be used, completed, and submitted to report the cargo related activities and user fees that are incurred for activities that occur on or after October 1, 2017. These revised self-report forms will be available on the DOT Harbors website, <http://hawaii.gov/dot/harbors/doing-business>, no later than September 30, 2017.

The following is a listing of the revised self-report forms that will reflect the new rates that take effect October 1, 2017:

Overseas Wharfage Report,
Overseas Transshipment Wharfage Report (65a),
Inter-Intra-Island Wharfage Report,
Inter-Intra-Island Transshipment Wharfage Report 65(b) and 65(c),
Inter-Intra-Island Transshipment Wharfage Report 65(d),
Pipeline Toll Report (Private) and
Pipeline Toll Report (State)

Please note that the Harbors Division will accept, as valid data, the quantities that are reported rounded to two decimal places for the units of measure –“ton” (example: 38.25 tons) and “mbf”– and the Harbors Division will accept as valid data, quantities that are reported rounded to four decimal places for the unit of measure –“bbl”–. All other quantities reported for the **unit of measure** of “**each**”, which is generally used for, but not limited to, the reporting of quantities for automobiles, shipping devices, empties and pallet load **and the unit of measure** of “**head**” which is used to report livestock, **must be reported** on these Wharfage reports, as **whole numbers with no decimals**. **Decimals are not considered as valid** reporting of the quantities for these **units of measure, (each and head)**, for these types of cargo, as such, the reporting of decimals are not allowed. Reports reflecting data with decimals for units of measure “**each**” or “**head**” may be considered to be invalid reports that have not been properly filed which the Harbors Division can possibly reject; such rejection may render those reports to be delinquent reports subject to delinquent report fees/charges as provided for in HAR §19-44-6.1.

The approved amendments to Chapter 19-44, HAR effective February 1, 2010, eliminated the charge for empty containers, but **all empty container activity must be reported** on the Wharfage Self-report forms. It is important to provide this information to DOT Harbors so that it can maintain accurate statistical information of container activity, including that of empty containers, at Hawaii’s commercial harbors. It is important to note that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers tracks this data and uses this data to make decisions that affect the Hawaii Commercial Harbors System.

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

Please remember to use the proper self-report forms to report cargo related activities and user fees that occur on or before September 30, 2017 by completing and submitting those forms that specify in their titles, "Rates Effective 02/01/2017 to 09/30/2017." All activity occurring on or after October 1, 2017, must be reported by completing and submitting those forms that specify in their titles, "Rates Effective 10/01/2017 to 06/30/2018."
