We have a study to look at improvements from Henry Street to Kamehameha III, however, with our priority to system preservation and improving the condition of our roadways, this effort has been put on hold for the immediate future.

### 3. Online Survey Comments:

a. Continue with follow up surveys. Help highway users and general public get more involved in Transportation Improvement program. Professional planners plus

ordinary people inputs equals vision and practical outcomes. - Thank you for the comment. We will continue to improve our public involvement processes & transparency. b. Need to widen Highway 11 between Henry Street and King Kamehameha III. Need to fund more West Hawaii Island Road projects. - Thank you for the comments. They have been forwarded to the HDOT Hawaii Island District Office. HDOT recognizes that there is a congestion need in the south Kona area. We have a study to look at improvements from Henry Street to Kamehameha III, however, with our priority to system preservation and improving the condition of our roadways, this effort has been put on hold for the immediate future. c. Anything that improves emergency egress in Puna and eases congestion. Mahalo for your efforts and transparency. - Thank you for your comments. They have been forwarded to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office. As we address the impacts of the ongoing volcanic eruption, we have implemented some congestion relief measures, the latest being restriping to increase capacity on Keaau-Pahoa Road. We are also looking at ways to improve the capacity of the intersections on Keaau-Pahoa Road. Meanwhile we are working on developing evacuation routes for Lower Puna.

d. Take over roads in HPP. Give us tax money to use on HPP roads. We pay tax. We pay gas tax and use gas on HPP roads. System did not let me select low on HS9. - Thank you for your comments. We have forwarded them to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office. The Roads in HPP are privately owned. Unless there is an "immenent domain" situation occuring, this discussion of ownership of the roads should start with the owners or perhaps HPPOA? We will also look into the online survey hiccup you mentioned for HS9.

e. Why did u cancel the public meetings in Puna District on the Big Island? U r sending a clear message we don't count even though we r the fastest growing district in the state. - Thank you for your comment. Due to the ongoing volcanic event, we canceled the Puna meeting. We are sorry for the inconvinience. There is/was a meeting scheduled in Hilo, which we encourage people to attend. Barring that, we welcome STIP comments via our email, "hwy.stip.projects@hawaii.gov".

f. Hwy 130 must be TOP priority! - Thank you for your comment. We have forwarded your comments to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office. We are working very hard to address the impacts to Route 130 during the current volcanic event. Meanwhile, some of the future improvements we are working on include intesection improvements on Route 130.

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g. Folks along hwy 137 no longer have access to public transportation due to the lava flow. What is being done toward providing service so that residents without vehicles are able to get to goods and services? - Thanks for your comments. We have forwarded them to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office. HDOT is working to provide a second emergency access parallel route to the west of Route 130 to help provide access for residents. Hopefully, residents and other agencies that are providing assistance with supplies and services will be able to use this emergency access.

h. Please provide secondary access for lower Puna beyond our cracking Hwy 130. Thousands of residents are currently at risk of isolation. - Thanks for your comments. We have forwarded them to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office. HDOT is working to provide a second emergency access parallel route to the west of Route 130 to help provide access for residents. Hopefully, residents and other agencies that are providing assistance with supplies and services will be able to use this emergency access.

i. There needs an to other ways to Hilo besides the 130 Open railroad all the way to town from Hpp. Pave 40th all the way. Pave G road from Ainaloa to Fern Acres.

Also a road just above the zoo on Stainback that connects to Saddle would be amazing. Give people options!!!! Stop building new roads in Kona when we need help Hilo side, my god I can't even see the lines in the road (130 Hpp area) but Kona gets a new highway. Thank you for your comments. They have been forwarded to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office and the Hawaii County Dept. of Public Works. The State is currently looking at improving congestion on Route 130 by first looking at improving the way our intersections operate. Also we have recently restripped areas of Route 130 to help provide some extra capacity. Furthermore, the Hawaii District Office has recently initiated an effort to improve pavement markings and install safety rumble strips, islandwide. Alternate routes for the region are being considered, but do require much planning and funding.

j. VAST need for improved service in Puna, which has been underdeserved to the extreme - Thank you for your comments. They have been forwarded to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office. As we address the impacts of the ongoing volcanic eruption, we have implemented some congestion relief measures, the latest being restriping to increase capacity on Keaau-Pahoa Road. We are also looking at ways to improve the capacity of the intersections on Keaau-Pahoa Road. Meanwhile we are working on developing evacuation routes for Lower Puna. Alternate routes for the region are also being considered, but do require much planning and funding.

k. Appreciate the opportunity to voice my opinion. Your improvements have made a positive impact on our quality of life - Thank you for your positive comments. They have been forwarded to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office. We appreciate your words of support. We continue to strive to maintain and improve the condition of our roadway transporation system as best as possible.

I. To prioritize multi-modal transportation when touching any streets, to increase safety & access for ALL users-not just motorists. - The Highways Division has a Bicycle and Pedestrian policy as well as a Complete Street policy that allows us to include bicycle and/or pedestrian facility improvements as well as Complete Street improvements in general, if feasible. This is in addition to any stand alone Bike/Ped/Complete Street scoped projects. Currently, our priority is to preserve and maintain our existing highway system, but these system preservation projects have been good candidates for bike, ped, and complete street scope additions.

m. Pls prioritize lower Puna safety and alternate routes due to this eruption. - Thank you for your comments. HDOT is working to provide a second emergency access parallel route to the west of Route 130 to help provide access for residents. Hopefully, residents and other agencies that are providing assistance with supplies and services will be able to use this emergency access.

n. Highway 11, mp15to17 shoulder lane for slow moving vehicle use. High use of shouler now to let traffic pass safely! - Thank you for your comments. They have been forwarded to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office. Perhaps an operational improvement can be determined.

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o. Saddle Road extension is terrible vanity project. Get rid of it. They just did improvements/widening to Waikoloa Road only 1/2 mile away. No need for this. Save \$100m.

Just keep it safe. Mahalo! - Thank you for your comments. The Daniel K Inouye Highway Extension is meant to add regional E-W vehicular capacity and help split traffic away from the Kawaihae Road and remains a priority. Given this, HDOT is looking at how this project could be fully funded considering our current priority is to improve the condition of and maintain our existing highway system.

p. Keep up the good work! - Thank you for your positive comments. They have been forwarded to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office. We appreciate your words of support. We continue to strive to maintain and improve the condition of our roadway transporation system as best as possible.

q. A bypass road in waimea needs to be addressed the traffic is horrible. Also the Lindsey (Road) kawaihae intersection is dangerous - it needs a light. - Thank you for your comments. They have been forwarded to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office and the Hawaii County Department of Public Works. HDOT is currently working on studying a mini Waimea Bypass, that would help improve local Waimea Town traffic circulation. Also, when completed, the Daniel K Inouye Hwy Extension (from Old Mamalahoa Road to Queen Kaahumanu Highway) will help to divert E-W regional traffic off of Kawaihae Road. I have included Hawaii County's Dept of Public Works since Lindsey Road is under their jurisdiction.

r. Road repaving in Waikoloa Village should be on the list as high priority. Some of the main roadway there are literally falling to pieces and are unsafe. - Thank you for your comments. They have been forwarded to the Hawaii County Department of Public Works. The Roadways that service Waikoloa Village, including Waikoloa Road are under County jurisdiction. s. The Waiaka bridge is of primary importance. Please consider a round about for the Kawaihae intersection. - The Waiaka Stream Bridge Replacement and Realignment of Approaches project will address any structural and operational issues at the intersection. HDOT is currently beginning a design effort for the improvement of the bridge and intersection.

t. Waikoloa Village needs another access road. The village has a high volume of paying tax payers and one access road is not acceptable. - Thank you for your comments. They have been forwarded to the HDOT Hawaii Island District Office and the Hawaii County Department of Public Works. Waikoloa Road and the roads that service the Waikoloa Village are under the County's jurisdiction. With the limited funding that is available to both HDOT and COH DPW, the current priority for the roadway system is to improve the condition of and maintain our existing roadways. Capacity building is currently being minimized and/or deferred.

u. Thanks for providing the opportunity to comment. - You are welcome.

v. Maps showing the locations of each project would be helpful. Bypass Road for Waimea is top priority; no funding for Waimea Trails and Greenways Project. - Thanks for your comments. They have been forwarded to the HDOT Hawaii Island District Office and the Hawaii County Department of Public Works. HDOT is currently working on studying a mini Waimea Bypass, that would help improve local Waimea Town traffic circulation. Also, when completed, the Daniel K Inouye Hwy Extension (from Old Mamalahoa Road to Queen Kaahumanu Highway) will help to divert E-W regional traffic off of Kawaihae Road. The Waimea Trails and Greenway project is a Hawaii County project, so it would be up to them to coordinate and propose federal aid funding for it.

y. Get aggressive with road repairs on the Big Island - PLEASE ! - Thank you for your comments. They have been forwarded to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office. The current priority in the state is to improve the condition of and maintain our existing roadways. While some of these efforts use federal aid and are listed on the STIP. Most of our roadway maintenance program does not use fedral aid and therefore is not listed on the STIP.

z. Finish the Queen highway - Thank you for your comment. It is anticipated that substantial completion of the Queen Kaahumanu Highway Widening project from Keahole Airport to Kealakehe Parkway will be sometime in August 2018. This should mean that it will be open to traffic at that time.

aa. Hopefully we can find the funds for much needed projects. - Thank you for your comment. Prioritizing the program by looking at the trade-offs is always challenging. Currently, there are more needs then there are funds. Currently, HDOT is in a system preservation mode where we are looking to improve conditions of the roadways and maintain the existing system. This is also a federal initiative, to preserve what we have.

ab. Suggest putting in goat warning signs in Waikoloa Road area and upper road. - Thanks for the comments. They have been forwarded to our HDOT Hawaii Island District Office and the Hawaii County Department of Public Works.
