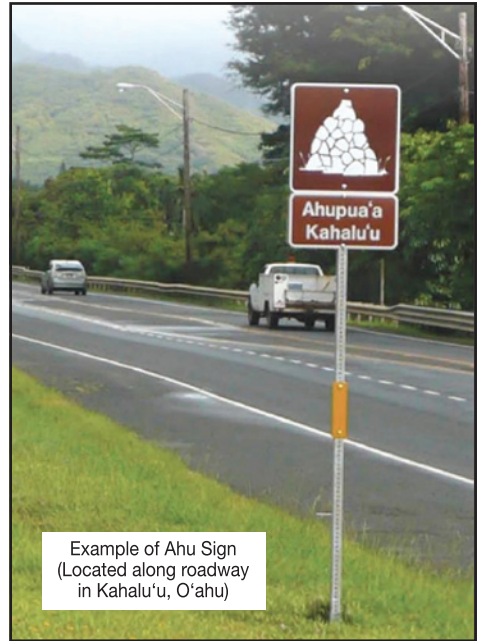
MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT, STIPULATION 12 REGARDING AHUPUA'A SIGNS

PUBLIC NOTIFICATION AND REQUEST FOR COMMENT

The Hawai'i Department of Transportation (HDOT), Hawai'i District office, is providing notice of the proposed installation of ahupua'a boundary markers along the Queen Ka'ahumanu Highway Widening, Phase 2 Project limits in the District of North Kona, Island of Hawai'i. The proposed markers will be placed within the HDOT's right-of-way (ROW) in proximity to eight ahupua'a boundaries within the project limits, including Kalaoa 1-4, 'O'oma 1, 'O'oma 2, Kohanaiki, Kaloko, Honokōhau 1, Honokōhau 2, and Kealakehe.

The purpose of the marker installation is to fulfill Stipulation 12 regarding "Ahupua'a Signs" as noted in the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for the project. The MOA was executed on March 17, 2015 by the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, Federal Highway Administration, and Hawai'i State Historic Preservation Officer.

Stipulation 12 requires that the HDOT consult with community groups and Native Hawaiian Organizations regarding the location, design, and installation of the markers. Therefore, the HDOT requests public review and comment on the ahupua'a boundary locations as shown in the photograph to the right and as shown in the map below.
