Dear Mr. Butay:

We are pleased to share the enclosed Federal Highway Administration Hawaii Division's accomplishments for Performance Year (PY) 2018 which runs from June 1, 2017 to May 31, 2018. Our efforts were based on our evaluation of program level risks and opportunities. You'll see that as in the past few years, our objectives focused on assisting Hawaii in complying with new requirements for performance measurement, and improving project delivery to reduce the balance of unexpended obligations also known as the "Pipeline." At the end of fiscal year 2014, the Pipeline stood at \$758 million and together we have brought it down to its current \$468 million.

Of course, the progress we have made so far wouldn't have been possible without a strong partnership with the Hawaii Department of Transportation and a lot of hard work on the part of both our staffs. These accomplishments are truly shared, just as the goal of reducing the Pipeline to \$450 million by the end of this fiscal year is a shared goal. As we enter the final quarter of the fiscal year, achievement of our goal is in sight. While this is a good time to reflect on the remarkable progress we've made in the last few years, it is also worthwhile to remember that we still have work to do.
