

FY 2023 Estimated Expenditure Highways (in millions)





Proposed budget (in millions)





FY 2023 Estimated Expenditure Airports (in millions)









Lessons Learned



- Modernize old processes
 - Streamline using state eProcurement system
 - eConstruction
 - Financial Management System
- Increased expectations for public outreach
- Elevate issues to HDOT team as soon as possible



Public Expectations



- More ways to reach out to communities that will be impacted by projects
 - Email sign ups
 - Text/SMS
 - Websites
 - Door-to-door
 - CMS in crucial decision points
- Work significantly affecting access needs to use variety of ways to inform users
- Need to consider advance notice (at least 2 weeks) and ways for public to provide feedback on work (24/7 hotline)


