II. Approval of the Minutes

The Committee approved past meeting minutes unanimously for the following dates: September 24, 2024, October 15, 2024, October 29, 2024, and November 26, 2024. Motions and seconds provided by various members.

III. Presentation by Safe Routes Partnership

Marisa Jones from Safe Routes Partnership presented the 2024 Making Strides State Report Card, which evaluated Hawaii's support for walking and biking, scoring 132 out of 200 points. She highlighted the need for specific goals to increase walking and biking mode share and proposed the development of a statewide Safe Routes to School plan. The discussion also included mini grants awarded to communities in Southern California, aimed at enhancing access

to funding for infrastructure and community engagement projects. Some key recommendations included:

- Developing an active transportation mode share goal for Hawaii
- Providing a local match for communities with state funds.
- Offering mini-grants/planning grants to develop the SRTS project pipeline with communities.
- Addressing minimum site requirements for schools.

Participants shared insights on successful funding applications in Louisiana and Arizona, and discussed strategies for improving relationships with schools in Hawaii.

III. Discussion and Appropriate Action on Approach to Meeting Law's Mandate

Chair Rooney provided some administrative information about meeting invites both for the series and monthly. She also provided updates on the final report available on the Hawaii Department of Transportation's website. Some feedback included the inclusion of state projects, which will affect the desired project recommendations and timeline. The Committee was encouraged to recommend future spending with a deadline for obligating funds set for June 30, 2024. Given the report to legislature was completed, the Committee also confirmed the next steps going forward:

- Develop a comprehensive statewide SRTS plan and program
- Invest in a strong network of SRTS staff
- Recommend projects to HDOT for funding
 - Fund existing county-based SRTS plans, programs, and projects
 - Launch a process to solicit and evaluate new project proposals (revised to match report to legislature)
 - Evaluate current projects (state and county) to move some forward

See final report to legislature for additional detail. Specifically, with the SRTS plan, the Committee has specific questions about moving forward under a current open-ended contract with Hawaii DOT and the best mechanisms to do so; they will follow up with the Deputy Attorney General for further information.

A member of the public wanted to make sure the local neighborhood boards were consulted about future projects.
